Tell us about your educational background.

I received my AA from Scottsdale Community College in 2016 then took a five-year hiatus from school. In Fall 2021, I made the decision to return to school to obtain my bachelor's from Arizona State University. After switching my major a few times, I settled on General Studies so I can select from a variety of degrees to pursue for my master's.



Describe your most rewarding college experience(s).

I was very intimidated coming back to school after a long break but told myself everything would be fine if I gave my best and at least passed my classes with a C. I wanted to graduate as soon as possible so I took five classes each semester and three classes in the summer. It was rough at times, but I proved to myself I could do it. My greatest accomplishment was graduating Summa Cum Laude with a 3.81 GPA, something I thought would be impossible when I first started taking classes again.

Can you summarize your educational background?

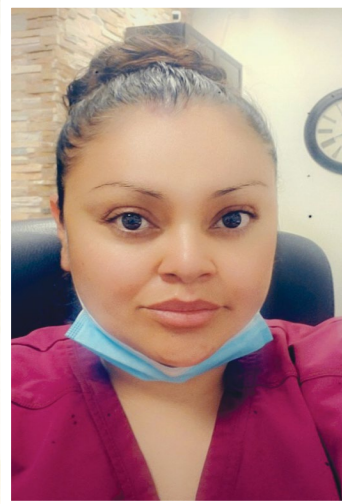
I didn't finish high school but eventually got my GED. What made me want to go further was that I got my GED on the first try after two weeks of studying. So I went on to take college courses at Rio Salado [College]. I wasn't sure what I was interested in, so I just started taking general courses. I started out with Computer Tech and completed level 1 and level 2 and got a certificate for that. Then I went on to Graphic Arts, earning certificates for that as well. I made a decision to go to Phoenix College to start my journey [to become] a dental hygienist and ended up taking courses in dental assisting. My instructor was a medical assistant, which I found very interesting, so I decided to pursue that as my career. I went to Pima Medical Institute and did their nine-month program to become a medical assistant; I went out for an externship and stayed with the company for a little over a year. While I was working, I decided to continue my education even further because I wanted to become a manager one day, so I got my associates degree in Health Care Administration. So it was a battle to get my confidence up, which was a struggle on its own. While going to school I also ended up pregnant; I had to take care of my baby as well as take courses. Then eventually I had a job, a baby, and I went back to school. With all the obstacles and things looking like they were against me, I pushed back. Whenever my back was up against the wall, I swung and hit things out of the park.

What advice would you give people considering higher education?

Go ahead and get an education. Take advantage now. Don't give up on what you believe in, and take this opportunity to push yourself a little harder because it does get easier later. If you think you're not good enough, tell yourself something different, because if a person like me can do it, I believe you can as well. What do you hope to accomplish in the next 10 years?

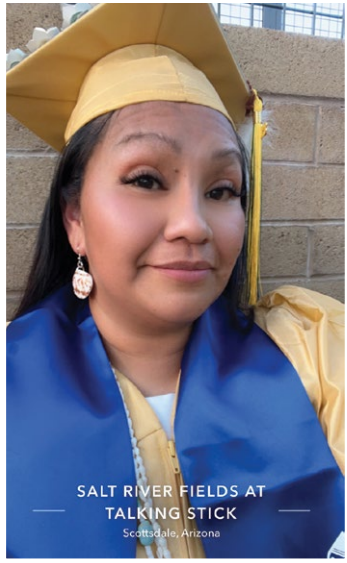
In the next 10 years I hope to be working for the Community with the Forensics team.

What do you hope to accomplish in the next 10 years?

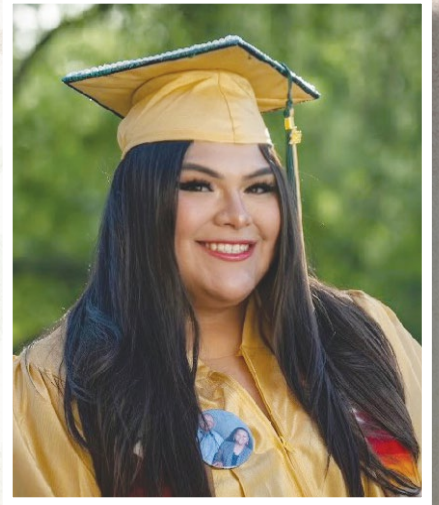
I want to continue learning, that is for sure. I am still uncertain what I want my career to be ... but what I do know is that I would like to learn as much as I can and come back to help my community.
